### **DUE TO THE EVER INCREASING CHANGES IN OUR SOCIETY, IT HAS BECOME NECESSARY TO ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING RULES THAT WILL TAKE AFFECT AT THE BEGINNING OF THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR:**

**#1:** Cell Phone, iPhone, etc. possession will not be allowed unless there is a legitimate reason, written and signed by a parent/guardian, stating why the student needs to have this form of communication beyond school hours. All phones, etc. must be turned into the school office upon arrival and will be returned at the end of the day. If an unauthorized device is found in a student's possession, it will be confiscated for the remainder of the school year and returned on the last day of school.

**From Mrs. G.:** *I am very aware of how accustom we've become to direct and automatic communication. My concern arises in our ever-increasing dependence on such communication and the adverse effects on our children. As a principal, I am concerned about the amount of texting, the content of the texts, and the message we are sending children regarding social skills. Kids are texting across the table, on the bus, during dinner, during homework, in the middle of the night, and in the wee hours of the morning. I cannot, in good conscience, promote the use of such communication at the elementary age. I encourage parents to educate themselves on the issue, take proactive measures, be aware of your child's use, and teach and exemplify when it is, and is not, appropriate to use such communication.*

**#2:** Athletic Awards Night Apparel: School uniforms are not required, however, students are to dress to exemplify respect for themselves, their achievements, their school, their coaches, and their sport. Jeans, shorts, and t-shirts will not be allowed.

**From Mrs. G.:** *We are preparing our children for the future. Preparation includes teaching our students appropriate attire for important events. One way to express pride in our accomplishments is through our appearance. The Athletic Awards Night is one opportunity for our children to present themselves in a position of honor and recognition. I wish to compliment those students who were dressed nicely and paid attention during awards night. Be proud of yourselves!*

## APRIL/MAY/JUNE APPAREL + UNIFORM ISSUES:

Students may wear shorts and capris during the months of April, May, and June. Obviously, pay attention to the weather. We will be going outside for recess and P.E. as much as possible.

Capris and shorts are to meet the same standards as pants (Flat front, no flares, no cargo or patch pockets.)

We have noticed that the kids are getting more and more lax in following uniform requirements, especially tucking in shirts, wearing belts, shoe type, and hair length.

I would like to take a minute on a soap box regarding shoe tying. I know there are much larger issues in life, but...we are constantly on students, younger and older, about tying their shoes. All it takes is for the child behind them to step on their laces for them to end up with a broken nose or worse. We had fire and tornado drills this week. A number of the kids did not have their shoes tied. Imagine the problems that could occur if someone tripped over, or stepped on, shoelaces during an actual emergency, causing a child to fall, and possibly fall into other children. It's our job to address this while the kids are at school, but I would also ask that you stay on top of this at home to help make it a habit. Please help us keep our children safe by teaching your child/children to tie his/her shoes and staying on top of keeping them tied.

## ISTEP+ INFORMATION

The second round of ISTEP testing will take place April 26<sup>th</sup>-May 5<sup>th</sup>. This test will be multiple-choice and will include the same subjects as the first round:

English/Language Arts in grades 3-8

Mathematics in grades 3-8

Science in grades 4 and 6

Social studies in grades 5 and 7
